Please join us on Saturday February 11 at Temple Israel for a special Shabbat Shira service filled with beautiful music sung by members of Temple Israel and Or Haneshamah Reconstructionist Synagogue.

Shabbat Shira celebrates the reading of the Song of the Sea from Exodus. We will once again relive the story of leaving the slavery of Egypt, witnessing God's power as the Sea of Reeds was split before us, allowing us to walk across on dry land. Once safely on the other side of the sea, Miriam led the people of Israel in a celebration of freedom with song and dance.

have memories of being dropped off by your parents at whichever supplementary school that you dreaded. Yiddish for Pirates : being an account of Moishe, the Captain, his Meshugeneh Life & Astounding Adventures, His Sarah, the Horizon, Books & Treasure, as Told by Aaron, His African Grey by Gary Barwin will be reviewed by Ruben Friedman

The novel set in the years around 1492, Yiddish for Pirates recounts the compelling story of Moishe, a Bar Mitzvah boy who leaves home to join a ship's crew, where he meets Aaron, the polyglot parrot who becomes his near-constant companion..

Although this is Ruben's first review for Temple, he is well known as a writer of humour columns and reviewer of books for Ottawa Jewish Bulletin. He was also a writer and performer for the JCC Yiddish performance group for 13 years.
