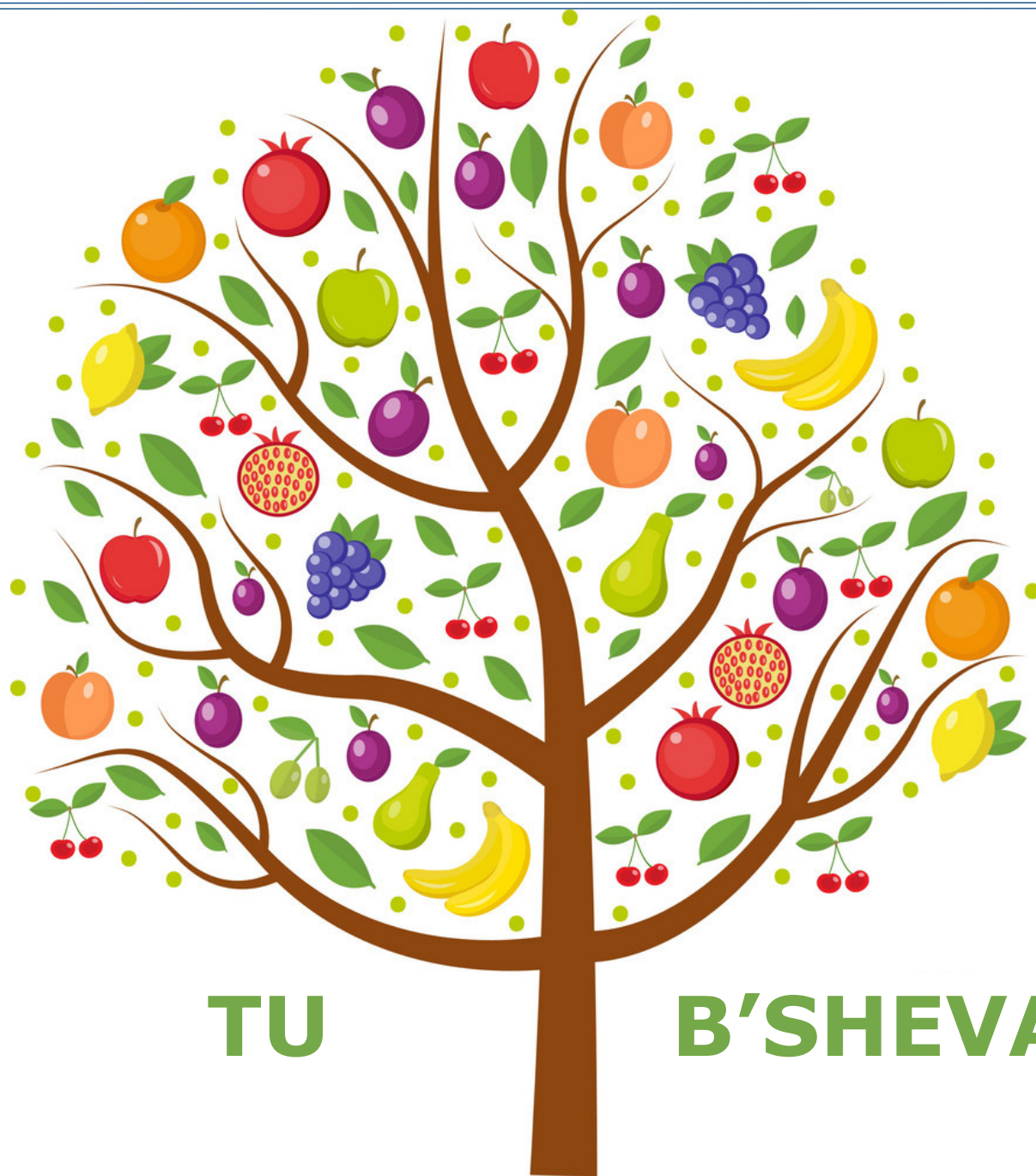

## From the Pulpit



It's not every day that you have the opportunity to join 5000+ brothers and sisters for Kabbalat Shabbat services. I and our all star delegation of Temple leaders had this unique opportunity recently at the Union for Reform Judaism Biennial in Chicago. True, the room was diverse in every way, but we shared so much as Reform Jews committed to leading our people into the next generation. Our values, our passion, our Torah bound us together as one.

A few highlights to share:

- The president of our movement, Rabbi Rick Jacobs, focused us on expanding the concept of big tent Judaism. Whether considering ethnicity, gender identity, family formation, just to name a few topics, we are called to affirm the countless ways to serve Jewishly. He introduced the term "Jew adjacent" as in members of our community who are not formally Jewish, but support their Jewish families and community. The term "Jew adjacent" better describes the commitment offered by these loved ones, rather than defining oneself based on what one is not, ie. non Jew.

- We were inspired to serve as loud and proud voices for pluralism in Israel. Our progressive brand is under threat by the Orthodox monopoly of the state and we were reminded of the need to demonstrate both our love of Israel and our commitment to our liberal practices. - I had the honour of representing the Temple on a panel examining young family programming. Rather than sit orderly, we left our rows and explored our youthful sides with song and creativity. Our youngest members will carry our hopes and dreams, we're called to prioritize their place in our spiritual homes.

## President's Message



It is a pleasure to join other lay leaders who work so diligently for our sacred community. Let me share a little about myself:

- I hold dear the Jewish values of learning, tikkun olam to repair our world – but even more so translating these into actions: inclusion, diversity, connectedness, welcoming.

- My Jewish journey took a big step in 1991 when my husband and I joined Temple and our daughter Sarah attended Religious School;

- Over the years, I participated in several 'Introduction to Judaism' courses, we joyously celebrated Sarah's Bat Mitzvah, travelled on a Temple trip to Israel with our extended family and in 2006, with Rabbi Garten's support, I became a Jew by Choice;

For the coming two years, I hope to focus on three areas:

Third: our building, our physical home. Almost 45 years old, its aging infrastructure needs rejuvenation. Temple's building is not only a physical home where we worship and celebrate but also a hub for progressive Jewish voices and actions such as education and social action programs, school and youth activities and inspiring music.

As we face essential upgrades to building systems, safety, security and accessibility that are estimated to cost \$2-3M, it makes sense to plan thoughtfully to maximize these investments to meet future needs. Our vision is our guide.

Lastly, I believe in communicating. I will strive to listen to congregants, consult committees and share the challenges and results of the Board. If you can help with communications, it would be a mitzvah! Shema is our command to listen, with our ears, our hearts, our minds, our souls.

## School News



### FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Our new TIRS and TI ShinShinit, Shai Sagi, arrived from Israel at the end of November. She is settling in nicely both in our school and shul and has started to run programs with our kids in most grades starting with our Chanukah program on December 8th. Shai has hit the ground running and we look forward to an amazing year with her. She will generally be working

in the school on Sundays and Mondays and some Wednesdays as well as joining us for Shabbat morning services approximately twice per month starting in January. Please introduce yourself to her if you see her.

November and December were very busy for our Grades 7-10 in TI High. We had guest speakers that engaged our older students in very deep and thoughtful discussions on antisemitism and antizionism in our lives and in the media. We learned how to continue to support Israel in a variety of ways even if we don't agree with all of the policies or goings on. We also attended the Knitting Pilgrim multifaith program where some of our students actually learned how to knit!

Our JYG (Junior Youth Group) continues to offer creative programming that brings up to 25 Grade 6-8 participants. Your child does not have to be a student in TIRS to join us! JBotics is underway thanks to a microgrant from JFO, Dungeons and Dragons with a Jewish twist has returned, and our tweens are already gearing up for a Trivia afternoon on January 5th. Plans are underway for a Shabbaton with Temple Solel in Mississauga January 31st to February 2nd. (See flyer). There is also the possibility that we will be joined by Temple Emanuel Beth Shalom in Montreal. I met with the Directors of Education from both synagogues at the URJ Biennial. I hope to be able to plan this type of exchange yearly moving forward.

TIRS, JYG and FROSTY joined the rabbi's installation Friday night service and then had mixers and a movie. This weekend, we will be volunteering at In From the Cold at Parkdale United Church which is an annual event. We have so many eager volunteers that I have to plan for a second session. Not a bad predicament to be in but I find myself having to turn people away as we are only allowed to have 20 and we had over 30! We are in the process of hiring a new FROSTY Advisor. More information to come very soon. Thank you so much to Lisa Rossman for her years as our JYG and then FROSTY Advisor.

I attended my first Biennial last week and came back with so much information to share. I went to sessions for educators specifically and others that are relevant to our school, our families and to Temple Israel in general. From services geared to all grades, especially the younger ones, to involving grandparents; from engaging post-B'nai Mitzvah students to dispelling myths about Millennials; and from early childhood development to traditional vs interpretive music, I enjoyed it all! On the morning of August 3, 2014, ISIS fighters entered the Yezidi city of Sinjar, bent on total destruction. In the days that followed approximately 10,000 Yezidis were executed in cold blood – shot, beheaded, burned alive. As well, 7,000 Yezidi women and girls were abducted.

Since 2015 Project Abraham has been supporting the resettlement of Yezidi survivors of ISIS in the Greater Toronto Area. Now, with over 300 volunteers, we work to help these traumatized people re-establish their lives in the safety of Canada. With the freedom to practice the Yezidi religion without fear, we are empowering them to create a future for themselves and their children as fully integrated Canadian citizens.

## Biennial Review

Temple Israel's contingent of 6 participated enthusiastically in the Union of Reform Judaism (URJ) Biennial Conference in Chicago, Dec 11-15. This year the Canadian arm of URJ, the Canadian Council for Reform Judaism (CCRJ), offered a 'We the North' \$500 grant for first time attendees – and 4 of us benefited!

Thousands of Jews from across North America and around the world - including over 100 Canadians – gathered to learn, pray, share ideas, dance and sing, hear inspiring speakers and leaders of our Movement, reunite with old friends, create new connections, and make decisions about the policies of the Reform Movement.

Over 5,000 people attend the Biennial, every time slot offers about 10 program choices. Fortunately, there is a Biennial App to help sort out where, when and who. An extensive exhibit area offered Judaica, shul systems, even a kosher food cart! To participate from afar, plenary sessions were live streamed from the URJ website; canned versions are still available for viewing here: <https://www.urjbiennial.org/livestream-recordings>

Highlights of sessions our team attended:

*Margot Montgomery:* 'Supporting Jewish Adjacent Members in your congregation' introducing a new and positive term for the role of non-Jewish family members; 'Building a leadership pipeline in your congregation' how to create leadership opportunities and attract people to serve eventually on the Board; 'An Agenda for Reform: Based on the 2018 Survey of Canadian Jews' an interesting recent survey of over 2,000 Canadian Jews. The Powerpoint document is available through the Temple website.

*Sue Potechin:* How Your Congregation Will Benefit from Paying Serious Attention to Grandparents; Bright spots in post B'nei Mitzvah Engagement; Forget what you thought about Millennials: The Kids are right!

*Mark Kamins:* Emerging Artists' Showcase – introducing some newer and emerging voices in Jewish music; Creating Powerful Musical Artist-in-Residence Programs in your Congregation – what is your community seeking and how can an artist-in-residence program help you find it. Using Music to Build Bridges in Social Justice and Interfaith Endeavors; The Color of Love – exploring the intersection of religion and race in America through the memoir authored by Marra Gad.

*Dara Lithwick:* Until All of Us Are Free, None of Us Is Free, co-led by Dara with members of the JewV'Nation Fellowship: Jews of Color Cohort and the LGBTQIA+ Cohort in multi-cultural, multi-racial, and inclusive worship. Mobilizing Around the Environment and Climate Change: How Your Community Can Take Action; Beyond Tot Shabbat: Multi-Generational Community Building (featuring Rabbi Mikelberg); Canadian, Eh? What We Can Learn from the Canadian Reform Experience; Yoga Shalom: Restorative prayer, chant and embodiment practice.

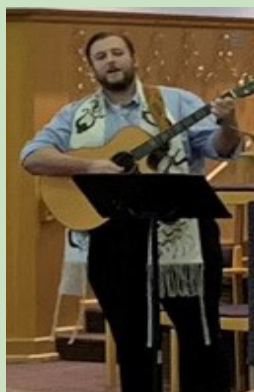


