# Shalom Temple Israel, Nice to Meet You

I can already anticipate many questions related to the upcoming High Holidays: "Rabbi, why are they so late?" True, we're more accustomed to the new year falling in early September and this year we need to wait till the end of the month. However,

I would suggest that the holidays are in fact right on time as always. This year we have a few extra weeks to prepare in earnest for the year 5780. The entire month leading into Rosh Hashana is traditionally a time of preparation. We look back on the year, celebrating our triumphs and learning from the areas where we did less well. Just ask important, it's a time to ground ourselves and get ready for the new year. What steps will we take to make this year the best that it can be? How will we make the most of our time?

## **President's Message**

Restoration of our flooded basement began in late June, hopefully to be completed in early to mid-August. This flood has impacted our finances, with the payment of the deductible and also HST on the overall repair costs. We expect

higher insurance costs starting at our upcoming renewal, not only because of this claim, but also due to the overall claims experience in the realty sector of the insurance market.

There are other financial impacts that we are dealing with, including higher snow removal costs, rabbi transition costs, and lower than anticipated 2018-19 dues received. As outlined in your 2019-20 dues letter, we welcome your generous dues contributions to ensure a strong and vital Temple Israel.

High Holiday preparations are under way. The Temple Israel Liturgical Choir is busy rehearsing every Thursday evening throughout the summer. They are eagerly anticipating working again with our Cantorial Soloist, Daniel Geigerman who will be be coming in July, August, and September for rehearsals. Daniel's return for the rehearsals and the High Holidays is being generously supported by the David Loeb Foundation, through the initiative of Arthur Loeb. We are very grateful.

The Nominating Committee, under Mindy Finkelstein, is moving forward over the summer. Getting to know who is available and interested, and getting people working on things that give them a chance to network is important for succession planning. Several Board and Executive positions will need to be filled for the November AGM.

Our current treasurer is leaving Ottawa shortly. We need a Temple member to step forward to take on this key position, starting by working with our experienced Finance Committee and staff who will provide guidance and assistance. Please contact me directly to discuss.

On Friday, August 16, there will be a Temple Israel Pride Kabbalat Shabbat Service at 6:15 PM. Following that will be a potluck vegetarian / dairy dinner. On Sunday August 25, there will be a Temple Israel tailgate/refreshments/ gathering before the Pride March. More information can be found in this bulletin.

We are eagerly anticipating Rabbi Mikelberg joining us on August 1st. There are many aspects to welcoming Rabbi Mikelberg to our sacred community, including gatherings involving various Temple cohorts, installation, interactions with Temple staff, committees, and the Board. These are being coordinated through our Transition Task Force co-chaired by Tamara Taub and Deidre Butler. Keep an eye out for updates and announcements.

### **School News**



This year we have had tremendous growth in programming bringing new families to TIRS and to our Temple Israel family. Although the school year is over, opportunities to get together continue to be available with new summer programs for families with young children. Our regular programs such as TOTally Shabbat, JBaby Oneg Shabbat at Hillel Lodge and JBaby Shabbat Playgroup do not stop for the summer. In addition, Ranit has

planned Parent and Family "Meet-ups" in parks and in the Wild Child Café. (See flyers in this bulletin for more information.) If you are interested, your friends may be as well. You don't have to be a member of Temple Israel to participate in these programs and, generally speaking, there is no cost.

This summer, I will be working together with Lisa Rossman, FROSTY Advisor, and Ranit Braun, JYG Advisor, on the development of new and exciting activities for our youth and for our school. This fall, TIRS will officially launch its new Grade 11-12 certificate program one Monday evening per month. This class will delve into Halacha vs modern laws in the modern State of Israel, Israeli government, elections and society and Judaism's perspective from Talmudic sources.

We are also excited for the arrival of Rabbi Mikelberg in August and I look forward to working with him regarding programs for young children, TIRS, youth, family and parent programming.

Things should be back in order at TIRS by early August. I have already confirmed one new teacher for the coming year and we are looking for one more to complete the team. Our TIRS staff will be participating in professional development to address the growing needs of students with special needs including learning disabilities, ASD, giftedness and ADHD. I take much pride in our school and strive to ensure that we offer the best Jewish education we can for your children.

We will need regular and back up Madrichim (TAs) as some of our current Madrichim will be moving on to university and other programs. Morah Karli will also be running a certificate program for our Madrichim starting in September.

While this year has thrown some challenges our way, staff, students and parents have adapted to the fast-changing circumstances with grace and ease. We thank everyone for pushing through the hard times and always seeing the silver lining ahead.

Jumpstart is a two-year incentive program that significantly reduces the cost of membership at participating synagogues and the Soloway Jewish Community Centre. It is a welcoming grant that is not based on financial need. It's Jewish Federation of Ottawa's way of saying "try us, you'll like us". It's time you joined already!
