
Every summer hundreds of Jewish youth spend their summer in

President's Message

Over 40 years ago, I arrived in Ottawa from Vancouver. While our kids were growing up, we became members of Temple,

and the children attended the Temple Israel Religious School.

I have found most of my dearest friends within Temple's walls, and have spent countless hours in all sorts of activities of Temple, from being on the Board, to organizing banquets, to sewing quilts, to teaching Kindergarten, to sticking labels on envelopes. Last year I was asked to become President. I was proud and happy to accept, because I think this is an important endeavour, giving me the chance to get to know people better, to work with our wonderful staff and our Rabbis, and to shepherd the congregation for two years, including the 50th Anniversary year the big party!.

I challenged myself to make this a productive term in office, and asked my helpers to work cooperatively and respectfully to make our synagogue succeed.

I feel that we are accomplishing a great deal. Remember, Jerusalem wasn't built in one day, either! Our High Holy Days went smoothly and with much joy and participation. The 50th Anniversary kick-off with the Josh Dolgin concert was a huge sellout success. We are well on our way to implementation of the second year of the Strategic Plan, with the segment on Governance ready for presentation at the November 17th AGM. Our school is flourishing, with new cochairs for the school committee and 22 newly registered children. We have welcomed nearly 35 families into the Congregation this year. We are establishing stronger ties across the community with other synagogues and Jewish organizations. In January, Karli Speevak Sladowski, nominated by us, will be travelling to Israel with a group of young future leaders, sponsored by the Jewish Federation of Ottawa (JFO). The 'menu' of items that should be updated and improved in our physical building in honour of the 50th Anniversary is being prepared. We have new leaders and workers for so many of our committees and projects. So much is going on!

But consider, for a minute, our personal good fortune. Nearly all of us can answer 'yes' when asked, "Do you have a TV in your home? Cell phones? Cars in the garage? Bikes in the driveway? A fully equipped kitchen? More than one bathroom?" The list of the advantages we enjoy goes on and on. One has only to travel in Africa, South America, or even in parts of Canada and the USA to realize how fortunate we are. Temple Israel members are among the most advantaged people in the world. How can we NOT share our prosperity with others within the Jewish community here and abroad? How can WE make the world a better place? How do WE act out the mitzvah of Tzedakah that is called for at Yom Kippur and throughout the year?

I know that Temple Israel congregants give countless hours and dollars to volunteer and charitable organizations year after year. In addition to this, I want to present you with three opportunities to support our sacred community, our school and our Jewish world:

First, buy State of Israel Bonds. If you buy one or more Israel Bonds - an excellent guaranteed investment - 10 years from now, when they mature, you might have forgotten that you even bought them. So, why not buy bonds in the name of the Temple Israel Foundation? You will receive a charitable tax receipt, Temple Israel (Ottawa) Foundation will have increased resources to ensure the

longevity of our Temple, and Israel will benefit from the money. I call that a win-win-win! In fact, it is hard to say no! I bought one already. To buy a bond, simply call the Israel Bond Office at 613-792-1142 and speak to the Director.

Second, if you already have a fund within the Temple Israel (Ottawa) Foundation, top it up this year. When a friend or relation has a Simcha, make a donation in their honour instead of the wine that will soon be drunk or the flowers that will fade and die. If you don't have an endowment fund, talk to your family about starting one. You can always contribute to any of the existing funds. Information on the TI(O)F can be found in this Bulletin.

Thirdly, let's talk about the 50th Anniversary project to rejuvenate our building. During the coming year, we will clean and paint and spruce up; the Bimah will be lowered so that with a short ramp it becomes accessible to everyone - especially those with mobility issues. The sound system will be upgraded, and equipment to make our services audible for all will be purchased. I hope that the lower level will be made more accessible. An elevator would be wonderful, but that is in the 'wildest dreams' category. During the coming months, you will be contacted by one of our members to discuss how you can help. Wouldn't 100 per cent participation be fantastic? Please think about how you can help, not only financially, but with your time and ideas and effort.

We have spiritual, educational and social activities of every age group. And we practice the values of a healthy, happy Jewish community. So here is the other challenge - tell yourself that you will attend more than one event at Temple in the next months and BRING A FRIEND. If you call a Jewish friend - or a former member, or a relative, or someone interested in what we do - and bring SOMEONE NEW to Temple - chances

Five generations of Temple member Dolf Hecht's family celebrate as patriarch turns 99 on November 18th

As Temple Israel celebrates its 50th anniversary, one of its oldest members, Dolf Hecht, is approaching his 99th birthday.

Dolf has three children, seven grandchildren, eight great grandchildren and one great great grandchild.

His daughter Ann Neumann, who lives in Gatineau, was already a member of Temple Israel when her parents moved to Ottawa from Montreal in 1977. They decided to join Temple as well, so that the family could attend services together.

"I've been a Temple member for 40 years," said Dolf, "beginning with Rabbi Gerber. Steve Garten is a great friend and has known me for 20 years. He buried my wife 20 years ago." Born in Munich, Dolf and his family were in England in 1939 and interned as enemy aliens. He then joined the British Army, became a British subject after the war, and went back to his job tailoring.

In 1957, he and his wife immigrated to Montreal, and then moved to Ottawa in 1977. His youngest son, Julian Bernard Hecht still lives in Montreal, and his older son Paul Hecht is an actor living in New York.

"I met Dolf originally at the Temple because his granddaughter and my daughter were in the same class at the Temple school," said family friend Joyce Pagurek. "Much later, I was interviewing seniors about 'Life Lessons,' what they'd learned, and what advice they'd want to give their children and grandchildren. His first reaction was that he wasn't a philosopher but that he'd talk to me anyway. What ensued were hours and

hours of taped conversations. He is indeed a philosopher. I fell in love with him! We became friends."

One of his comments to her for her "Life Lessons" interviews was that his "job" now was to "make memories" for and with his kids and grandkids. One of his dreams was to have a photo taken of the five generations of his family, and that dream came true in August.

Dolf is very inventive, always fixing and making things, she said. At Hillel Lodge, where he lives now, he's concocting tools from hooks and handles and tape to use for reaching, picking things up, and pushing buttons.

"This was a very independent man but one of the things that always impressed me was his adaptability," said Joyce. "He wanted to stay in his own apartment but couldn't do it on his own, and so, when he could no longer drive, he accepted rides, then cleaning help, later once or twice a week caregivers, a cane, then a walker and now a wheelchair. When his body gave out, he needed to move. It wasn't easy to accept that 'this is it' - his words - but once he got his head around that, the twinkle returned to his eyes; his wit and acerbic comments continue."

MHI is a federally incorporated charitable organization that was established in 2002 and currently includes more than 70 faith organizations.

Temple Israel was an early member of MHI and our congregants have continued to be actively involved ever since. MHI's mission is to provide and promote safe, affordable housing to lower income households in Ottawa.

Currently MHI owns forty-one affordable units at three different sites and is in the midst of building a beautiful new community of 98 family units in Barrhaven.

An initiative to build a 20-unit Veterans House for formerly homeless veterans is also underway.
