

From the Pulpit

On Saturday Oct 27th temple was filled with people celebrating Shabbat. A time to let the cares of the world recede and embrace the promise and beauty of God's creation. On this particular Shabbat, the beauty and calm was shattered as we heard the news of the shooting and tragic deaths at the Tree of Life Synagoque in Pittsburgh. Words cannot express the depth of our sorrow and

our hearts are with the Pittsburgh Jewish community and especially the members of the Tree of Life Synagogue.

We Jews are no strangers to violence. We have survived countless attacks and attempts at genocide. Yet we continue to prevail. The inherited wisdom of our tradition has taught us to be resilient.

Jewish communities around the world have come together in solidarity with families of those who were killed in Pittsburgh. Our response is not to seek revenge on the perpetrator. Our revenge is far sweeter, far more meaningful. Our revenge is to show those who would hate us that we are strong. That we will not be deterred from living Jewish lives. Our response is to call for a Shabbat of Unity! To encourage everyone, we know, Jew and non-Jew alike, to attend our services.

Ron Wolfson who wrote Relational Judaism says: "People will come to synagogues, Jewish community centers, federations, and other organizations for programs, but they will stay for relationships."

It is though the power of our relationships that we will draw strength from one another and continue to build Jewish life here in Ottawa and around the world. We can defeat hate by showing those who hate us how incredibly precious Jewish wisdom is. How it can lead us to live lives of meaning and purpose! Lives dedicated to pursuit of what is right and good in the world.

With all of the Tishrei holidays in September, it made for a rocky start for our students, especially the new ones. Other students who thrive on routine were affected by the "choppiness" of the schedule including a

Sunday off due to the tornado. The good news is that we can now coast through all the way to the Winter Break.

Our Grade 6 class led a beautiful service on October 12th. What a great way to start off the year! Grade 7 will be leading our Kabbalat Shabbat service on November 9th and our Gan Yeladim (Kindergarten) will be leading our Chanukah celebration service on December 7th. All of our class-led services on Friday nights are followed by a "Bring Your Own Dinner" where families are able to get to know other families over a meal and share in community. It is a great way for new families to meet and for the children to be together outside of school. By now, some of you have met Liam, our new ShinShin who is here from Israel for the year between high school and the Israeli army. Liam will be doing activities with our students on Sundays and Mondays and some Wednesdays for this school year as TIRS is his base school. Likewise, Temple Israel is his base synagogue and we welcome his Divrei Yisrael, his insight into Israeli events, holidays and notable Israeli figures. Liam is a very outgoing and warm addition to our school and shul. Introduce yourself to him --- if he doesn't introduce himself first!

November is Holocaust Education Month. TIRS and Temple Israel have been entrusted with artifacts by members of the Ottawa Jewish community to create a Pop-Up Museum at Temple Israel. The Pop-Up Museum is open to the community on Sunday, Nov. 4th from 12:30 – 4:00 pm and Monday, Nov. 5th from 6:30 – 7:15 pm. At 7:30 pm on Nov. 5th, Dr. Robert Ehrenreich from the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum (USHMM) will present, "Let the Artifacts Speak: Returning Humanity to Holocaust Victims." We are proud to bring this to you in collaboration with Carleton University's Zelikovitz Centre for Jewish Studies and Centre for Holocaust Education and Scholarship (CHES), as well as Jewish Federation of Ottawa, and USHMM. Everyone is welcome.

There are many events scheduled for families with young children, tweens and teens including TOTally Shabbat, JBaby Shabbat Play Group, Jr. Youth Group (JYG) and FROSTY. In addition, we have added new programs such as JBaby Oneg Shabbat at Hillel Lodge with children under the age of 4, Jr. Congregation for children ages 5-10, and Jr. Choir for children of all ages. programs can be found in this bulletin, on the Temple Israel website, and on the TIRS Facebook page.

Building Understanding: Sky Woman and Chanukah

Tuesday December 4, 2018 7-9 pm

Inspired by the recommendations of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, this Chanukah, Temple Israel will launch a series of programs of relationship building and mutual learning together with Ottawa-area indigenous peoples.

As Rabbi Morais highlighted in his Yom Kippur sermon, this is a perfect time for our congregation to embrace the Commission's messages, in particular Recommendation #49 which calls upon "all religious denominations and faith groups who have not already done so to repudiate concepts used to justify European sovereignty over Indigenous lands and peoples, such as the Doctrine of Discovery and terra nullius"

We are honoured to be working with Dr. Kahente Horn-Miller, Assistant Professor in the School of Indigenous and Canadian Studies and Co-Director of the Centre for Indigenous. Research, Language and Education at Carleton University. She has been providing excellent advice and input to a Task Force established by Temple Israel to reflect upon and respond to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission recommendations.

The Task Force has agreed that in addition to learning more about First Nations histories and cultures, there is a need to build, in an ongoing and open ended manner, sacred community with Ottawa-area indigenous peoples. To this end, the Task Force will lead the planning and implementation of an on-going series of programs and encounters. We begin with Dr. Horn-Miller's performance of Sky Woman on December 4th, as well as reflections from Rabbi Morais about the ways in which Chanukah is an appropriate opportunity for the launching of this initiative. The drawing of connections with Jewish life will be an important component of each such event and it is also hoped that the Temple Israel Religious School will become involved in appropriate activities.




Rebbe: The Life and Teachings of Menachem M. **Schneerson**, the Most Influential Rabbi in Modern History by Joseph Telushkin will be reviewed by Rabbi **Idan Scher.** Rabbi Scher was born and raised in Chicago, Illinois, but frequent trips to Ottawa to visit his large extended family always made the Nation's Capital feel like his second home. He earned an undergraduate degree from Yeshiva Shaar HaTorah in New York, a Masters degree in Talmudic Law from the Ner Israel Rabbinical College in Baltimore, and an M.A. in Public Policy and Management from John's Hopkins University.

Six million Jews were murdered during the Holocaust. The number is staggering. How do we convey that these were real people with real lives and families? Mr. Ehrenreich will discuss how personal items can turn the huge numbers of victims back into individuals and return their humanity, based on three case studies:

personal items discovered near shooting pits in Ukraine; damaged photographs from Poland; and a piece of mica from the Theresienstadt Glimmerwerke (mica works).

Morning Minyan


Join us semi-monthly for our Thursday morning minyan
