




The tour will have a skilled educator and an experienced Rabbi as your guides. Accommodation will be in 4 and 5 star Hotels and it includes two meals a day.

The Western Wall or the Kotel has become the rallying point for the fight for Jewish pluralism in Israel. The Orthodox establishment, firmly supported by Israel's current government, has decided that the wall should be under the auspices of the Orthodox Rabbinate, rather than what it has been for close to 2000 years, a pluralistic gathering place for all Jews.

Selichot is a time to reflect and consider important ideas. Join us as we delve into this controversial topic though videos, texts and discussions. Our conversation will be followed by refreshments at 9pm and Havdallah and a special Selichot service at 9:30pm including our choir.


Sunday October 22, 2017 - When Sonia Met Boris: An Oral History of Jewish Life Under Stalin by Anna Shtern-
