President's Message



With less than a third of my president's term ahead, I am reflecting on the focus for the next 7 months. At the 2019 Annual Meeting I proposed to nurture the sacred partnership with our then new Rabbi, to develop a leadership pipeline and to advance our building project. Despite the distractions of a pandemic, there is progress on these fronts and of course so many others!

Still ahead is a gathering of committee, task force, project and team leaders scheduled for Sunday morning May 16 to nurture a network of our volunteer leaders at Temple. Join us to find out more about the many initiatives that are on the go.

The Building Renovation Action Committee presented the architect's design to the March Board meeting where it was approved in principle. Next steps include cost clarification and financial planning leading to board recommendations to the congregation to be considered at a Temple-wide meeting. If the Congregation approves the building project, a fundraising campaign will follow. To preview the concept design, check out the article in this Bulletin for building renderings.

The Music Task Force (TF) chaired by Mindy Finkelstein reported to the April Board meeting at which Ritual Committee was also represented. Based on the important place that music plays at Temple, the TF recommends establishing a part-time 'Music Director' to lead and coordinate the musical components of Temple life. A standing "Music Sub-committee' of the Ritual Committee will advise and assist in this work with a mandate to be the musical conscience of Temple. Its scope includes coordinating lay cantors, choir and choir director and High Holiday soloists. A program of visiting music guest performers is proposed to enlighten and delight Shabbat congregants. The Board endorsed establishing a Music Sub-committee and supports the general direction of the other recommendations. The first step will be to recruit Music Sub-committee members with a passion for and knowledge of music at Temple. Please be in touch if you are interested!

From the Building Commitee

Proposed new design for Temple building will bring additional light, spiritually and physically

Temple Israel's Building Renovation Action Committee (BRAC) is delighted to be moving forward with the building concept design.

The purpose of BRAC is to design a renovation proposal for the Temple Israel building and grounds.

In a recent e-mail to Temple members, BRAC co-chair Patsy Royer shared the good news that on March 18th, during Temple's board meeting, the Board unanimously approved the proposed building concept design presented by Figurr Architects.

"The pandemic has created a profound longing for human contact, and the post-pandemic era is poised to be a moment of renewal for institutions, social movements and enterprises whose raison d'être is to bring people together," says Margot Montgomery, Temple president and BRAC co-chair with Patsy Royer.

A faith community like Temple Israel, which brings people together for both worship and social action, is well-placed to harness the pent-up demand for connectedness. The initiative to re-imagine the physical meeting place - the synagogue building - coincides perfectly with the idea that, post-pandemic, the world's mission is to 'build back better.'

BRAC members, including several Executive and Board members, the Rabbi, the Principal and the Executive Director, are focused on delivering a building renovation that meets Temple's future needs," she says. "We have learned much from past ventures in building projects and respect these lessons as we carefully proceed." And now Temple Israel is one step closer to that goal.

"Our architect, Figurr Collective, has extensive experience with Jewish institutions and other public architecture challenges in Ottawa and Montreal," says Margot. "They have worked hard to understand our needs and our challenges in funding a project of this nature."

Since the beginning of the project, BRAC has also been working with a professional fundraiser, Wayne Hussey Consulting, Inc.

"Temple Israel is a hub for liberal Judaism in Ottawa, a community grounded in both tradition and innovation," says Rabbi Daniel Mikelberg. "Our doors are wide open to people who are interfaith, interracial, LGBTQ, differently abled and more. We believe in honouring all paths to Judaism and fostering shalom in a fractured world. This project will improve our community's ability to inspire, and be safe and accessible so that it continues to serve as the spiritual home of generations to come."

"The design has been months in the making," says Patsy, "and based on consultation with BRAC members. It brings additional light throughout our synagogue - our spiritual home."

The next steps are to refine costs and finalize the design. Rabbi Mikelberg and Margot have begun meeting with some Temple members and have already received indications that over \$2,000,000 of the necessary funds will be donated over a number of years, nearly half of our goal!! Every one of us has an essential role as we build for our future. When our world calms down and we begin a formal campaign, we are eager to speak to you so that you, too, can be part of this exciting renewal.

"While it will take many months to finalize the architectural plans, obtain permits and raise funds, we look forward to seeing shovels in the ground as soon as possible," says Patsy. "We are inspired by the vision of our spiritual home serving future generations of Ottawa and area Reform Jews."

Supporting Temple Israel for the next generation

Ranit Braun discusses being part of the Temple since childhood, and planning for the future

Ranit Braun's Temple Israel journey began when her mother, religious school principal Sheli Braun, "schlepped" 10-year-old Ranit to work with her. She then "graduated" to helping in the office, to TA'ing, to teaching to where we are today.



Ranit is among the Temple members who have signed a Letter of Intent for Temple's Life and Legacy program. She has decided to support Life and Legacy because "I want my child to be able to have a thriving community in the future, so that he can one day bring his partner and children too."

Ranit cannot pinpoint exactly the year that she and then her husband and son became members, but Temple Israel has been a constant draw on her "slightly complicated Jewish journey."

"For anybody, it's complicated in general to find your community," she says, "but with the complications of a convert - albeit when I was an infant - and someone whose skin

color doesn't quite match the 'norm', on top of that the 'wild spirit,' and finding somewhere for me to feel welcomed, included and accepted, was often a challenge."

At Temple, she says, she "never felt 'othered' or judged, and while it took me some time to formalize my commitment to Temple through membership, I feel like Temple and myself were always B'Sheret. I often found comfort and guidance from members as I was growing up and who stuck with me all those years. Temple offers people the opportunity to really engage in shul life and to help shape our shul's future. I think Temple and I chose each other."

She loves the bond that congregants have with each other. "I love reading the comments during services, I love seeing people smile when they see each other and that is genuine and real. You can really feel the history and joy when people gather, and I really like that."

While she has been involved in Temple in some capacity for two decades, she says that this past year has been the most memorable as she has helped Temple move programming online. Despite the challenges, "it has been the most incredible journey to bring Temple directly into people's homes. I love working with other Temple members and getting to know people better, I feel like I have been given such a cool opportunity to help Temple move online. We have such a great group of people working to make this happen!"

Braun works full time at Jewish Family Services, but she also finds time to teach grade 2, to be JYG and FROSTY adviser, and to volunteer for Jbaby.

Ranit Braun is one of five siblings. "We mostly grew up in Ottawa; my father, Eli Braun, was the Rabbi at Beth Shalom and my mother was the Principal at Temple School. My siblings and myself are all adopted from different parts of the world, and we are all Jews of color. I take a great amount of pride in my family and I have an enormous amount of gratitude for the bonds that we share. My parents and sister and her husband and four kids all live in Israel, while myself and my older sister and two brothers are still here in Canada."

She is married to Jason Demorest, and the couple have a son named Gideon. But everyone knows him as 'Gibby'. You may have seen him pop into some Zoom meetings.

Initially it can all seem overwhelming to consider Life and Legacy, she says. "It may seem daunting at first to commit to something like this, wills, estates, lawyers...But when you give it some thought and get past the 'scary' paperwork, it all makes logical sense.

"On Tu B'shevat we speak about Honi and the lesson of leaving behind for future generations," she explains. "This is why we plant; this is why we plan. By making this commitment you are not just leaving money, but you are giving life to your community. You are giving life to our Jewish values and our future. And we can think from time to time that 'well, I give my membership fees, what more do you want from me?' But I think that what the question should be is: 'What more do I want for my children and my friends' and families' children?' The answer is everything... but I give what I can, and what's within my power. The Legacy program offers that opportunity."

A program of the Harold Grinspoon Foundation, Life & Legacy assists communities across North America, through partnerships with Jewish Federations and Foundations, to promote after-lifetime giving to build endowments that will provide financial stability to Jewish day schools, synagogues, social service organizations, and other Jewish entities.
