From the Pulpit

President's Message



On a sunny May morning the chairs of Temple committees, task forces and teams met virtually with board members for 2 hours to share updates and issues about Temple initiatives. We actively sought crossovers to coordinate and to build up our Temple Israel community. Thank you to the 29 dedicated Temple volunteers who participated. This was our second leaders meeting since

March 2020, full credit to Miriam Burke for starting and sticking with this new tradition. The next session is planned for early 2022.

David Cotsman is the chair of the Nominating Committee this year, and Tamara Taub represents the Board. Please be in touch to nominate future leaders for board positions beginning in November. The Board recently approved a Volunteer Awards policy and the call for nominees will go out in September for awards to be presented at the November Annual Meeting. It is not too early to share suggestions, please be in touch with me if you have nominee ideas or would like to serve on the committee.

As we gradually return to in-person services, initially outdoors in the Bayit backyard and then indoors as soon as we've taken extra precautionary steps, our thoughts return to the urgent need to renovate and improve our 46-year-old building. The Building Renovation Action Committee (BRAC) continues its work on refining the concept design with Figurr Architects, seeking cost clarity for the future construction climate and selecting a project manager to bring building expertise to our team. We are fortunate to have Mark Palmer as a new BRAC member, bringing experience with capital projects and wise counsel.

I am pleased to share that the Board has approved a 5-year contract with Rabbi Mikelberg to begin in July 2022, following his current 3-year contract.

ANTI-RACISM COMMITEE presents A Vitual tour of Uncle Tom's Cabin

Wednesday July 21, 2021 -10 am

Come one and all, Children and adults alike.

The anti racism committee of Temple Israel has booked a virtual tour of the historical site where Josiah Henson eventually established his home and built a self-sufficient community for fugitives from slavery. The site, situated on the grounds of the former Dawn settlement, is located near Dresden, Ontario. You will see original and restored buildings, including a homestead, church, barn and graveyard.

Henson himself was a former slave, an abolitionist, and a minister.

Harriet Beecher Stowe's 1852 anti-slavery novel 'Uncle Tom's Cabin', featuring a character named Tom, is loosely based on Josiah Henson.

Task Force on Truth & Reconciliation Update

On June 7th, 2021 we were very pleased to host a unique opportunity for Temple Israel and Or Hanashamah members to learn more about Indigenous issues in the form of a Virtual Kairos Blanket Exercise. This 3.5 hour activity included 15 Temple congregants, Rabbis Mikelberg and Lithwick, and 9 members of Or Hanashamah. The feedback received indicates that it was a very insightful and enriching experience for those who participated.

The KAIROS Blanket Exercise program is a unique, participatory history lesson - developed in collaboration with Indigenous Elders, knowledge keepers and educators - that fosters truth, understanding, respect and reconciliation among Indigenous and non-indigenous peoples.

A debriefing session for Temple participants as a follow-up to the event was an equally enriching opportunity for reflection and exploration of `next steps'. The meeting generated exciting program ideas explicitly about Jewish- Indigenous relations that will be at the centre of Task Force programming for the foreseeable future (watch for updates in the weekly e-bulletin).

In addition to this initiative, we are pleased to report that a new Prayer for Canada that includes Land Acknowledgement is quickly becoming an organic part of our Shabbat Ritual (minhag). Its third paragraph states that: "We acknowledge that the land on which Temple Israel gathers is situated on the unceded, unsurrendered Territory of the Anishinabe Algonquin Nation whose presence here reaches back to time immemorial. We are grateful to have the opportunity to freely worship on this territory, and we ask your blessings upon it, and upon us - and let us say: Amen."
