From the Pulpit



Okay, the New Year has Passed, Where to Now?

I love the Jewish calendar! It's astutely in touch with the seasons of our lives. It helps us find direction and apply meaning. We often focus on the joyous festivals in the yearly cycle, but there is much more.

Each year as the fall chaggim come to a close we look forward to the stories of Abraham and Sarah. How appropriate that as we emerge from the new year we seek grounding and advice with regards to next steps. Abraham alongside Sarah are instructed, "Lech Lecha - Go forth to a land that I will show you." We honour their courage, their faith, their daring nature. They appear to have no doubts. Of course we don't know the conversations they are having internally. I would guess it's anything but quiet. Significantly, God promises blessing, but the final destination is not clear.

Each of us are presently living Abraham and Sarah's narrative. We're emerging from lockdown in a host of ways, often unclear of the direction we are heading. That's okay. As leaders we are trailblazing forward as best we can. Sometimes we're taking two steps forward and one or two or three steps back. That's also okay. We know that we cannot passively wait for blessing, our actions are central to usher in these good tidings.

With care and grace, she led us through this tumultuous time and she deserves much credit for her efforts.

Rabbi Dara Lithwick is re-focusing her Temple efforts at the present time to the youth portfolio assuming the position of senior youth group advisor. In recent weeks she has brought renewed energy to our young leaders, reminding them how much we celebrate their role at Temple. She will continue to complement this work with outreach efforts as a volunteer.

Rebecca Zuckerbrodt has resigned as TIRS principal. We thank Rebecca for leading us boldly into the 5782 year and for her contributions during her time with our school community. We wish her the best in her future endeavours. We are excited to share that going forward three of our beloved teachers have accepted the responsibilities to serve as senior leaders of TIRS. You know them well: Ranit Braun, Karli Speevak and Jenny Burns. Combined,

the three have spent decades at Temple as students and teachers. They are passionate about everything Jewish, and TIRS holds a special place in their hearts. We know them as being creative souls, loving friends, and champions of Jewish education. They will be leading our community as a team and we are grateful to them for accepting this new responsibility.

As a closing note, some of us have been venturing back to the building. It's been a privilege to reconnect in person. True, things don't look or sound the same (we're so quiet all of a sudden!), but the warmth and purpose is consistent. It's good to come home. If you haven't tried yet, and you're comfortable being in person, come swing by! There is no longer a need to RSVP. A number of our older members could use help with a lift, please consider reaching out to a homebound friend and make Temple a date.

Onwards we go, as we know all too well, our new normal is anything but normal, but we can confidently look forward with hope. Together we will find our way to the "Promised Land."

President's Message



This is my last Bulletin column as my term as president ends with our Annual Meeting November 22. I offer this update on my priorities shared back in 2019.

First, we have a strong sacred partnership among Temple clergy, staff, lay leaders and congregants. Rabbi Mikelberg has accepted a 5-year contract to 2027, our school has returned to in-person instruc-

tion while offering some virtual classes to meet the needs of our students. Both FROSTY and Junior Youth advisors are actively engaging our youth in their Jewish journeys. The board has held monthly productive meetings and work by committees, task forces and teams is steady and effective.

One example is the Building Renovation Action Committee (BRAC). In March, the board approved an architectural concept design and work proceeds with Figurr Architects on enhancements to this design and to update costs. This week the Board approved hiring a Project Manager from Colliers and a construction expertise and costing small contract to assist in addressing some design challenges and updating building costs. Through quiet fundraising by Rabbi and lay leaders, 2.3M is pledged to date, including cash on hand. The BRAC co-chairs look forward to presenting board recommendations to the whole congregation in early 2022.

My third objective for my presidency was to develop a leadership pipeline. A successful second meeting of Temple leaders was held in May and another is planned. A strong succession plan for lay leaders is in place and the Board team offers both seasoned and fresh perspectives for the work ahead.

When I look over this pandemic presidency, I am proudest of how our people - clergy, staff, lay leaders, teachers, congregants - were able to rally and get out in front of the significant challenges thrown our way, a reality that persists - good thing we are getting good at this! Yasher koach!

The coming year, I look forward to my past president role, sharing my experience with the Board and continuing as BRAC co-chair. As we build up this Temple Israel community, to succeed we need a building that helps us to reach out, adapt and include everyone!





Virtual Presentation via Zoom by Dan Rubenstein and Nancy Dyson about their book St. Michael's Residential School: Lament & Legacy (all royalties go to the Indian Residential Survivors Society in North Vancouver).

A short synopsis of the book is below.

"In 1970, they were hired as childcare workers at the Alert Bay Student Residence (formerly St. Michael's Indian Residential School) off northern Vancouver Island... When a delegation from the Department of Indian and Northern Affairs visited St. Michael's, the couple presented a long list of concerns. The next day, they were dismissed by the administrator of the school. Forty-five years later, the Truth and Reconciliation Commission Reports were released in Ottawa. The raw grief and anger of residential school survivors were palpable and the authors' troubling memories of St. Michael's resurfaced. Dan called Reconciliation Canada, and Chief Dr. Robert Joseph encouraged the couple to share their story with today's Canadians".

Task Force Update

We encourage you to join our exciting program of Sunday morning presentations in Fall 2021/Winter 2022 (most likely via Zoom) on the theme of Jewish Indigenous Relations in Canada.

The first of these presentations took place on October 3 when Rabbi Mikelberg and Kim Wheatley reflected on their family histories of trauma with a focus on their grandmothers.

Upcoming events include the following:

Sunday, November 7, 2021

ZOOM presentation by **Dan Rubenstein** and **Nancy Dyson** about their book St. Michael's Residential School (see flyer on this page)

January 23, 2022 (tentative)

Discussion by **Simon Brascoupe** and **Michael Parkin** on their collaboration to co-create an artistic expression of Temple Israel's Land Acknowledgement. The focus will be on the process of their collaborative efforts so far.

March 6, 2022

Dr. David Koffman (J. Richard Shiff Chair for the Study of Canadian Jewry in the Department of History at York University, and the editor-in-chief of the journal Canadian Jewish Studies / Études juives canadiennes) will present a wide-angle introduction to the history of encounters between Canadian Jews and Indigenous peoples, from the settlers and fur traders of the 18th century up to our present moment of national reconciliation debates. Touching down on several emblematic moments from coast to coast to coast, the talk argues for the intellectual and moral value of reframing Canadian Jewish history as not just a history of immigration, but as one of both migration and colonialism. There will be plenty of time for Q&A.

March 13, 2022

Presentation by Temple Israel congregants Charlie **Khazzam** and **Marie-Carmen Berlie**, medical doctors who have lived and worked half-time in a Northern Indigenous community and half in Ottawa, about their experiences and their insights.



As we approach Remembrance Day, I am honoured to tell you about a connection that brought a Bar Mitzvah student, his parents, and other members of Temple Israel as well as the Jewish community of Ottawa together through tzedakah (charity) and gemilut chasadim (acts of kindness).

First, allow me to introduce you to the Koskie Family and Leona Crabb who are all members of Temple Israel. Jack Koskie celebrated his Bar Mitzvah in May and his chosen tzedakah project was **A Quilt of Valour**. Jack asked family and friends to help support his charity and he was able to raise \$3,000 for this worthy cause.

A Quilt of Valour™ is a hug from a grateful nation and a tribute to an injured Canadian Armed Forces member, past or present. They are handmade by volunteers and donated with great respect and honour. Jack's contribution was enough to sponsor 12 quilts for worthy recipients, some of whom he was able to recommend. He learned about this cause when his mother, Angela (a retired RCAF Major), was surprised to receive her quilt last year. It was because of Angela's reaction that Jack chose this as his tzedakah project.

Both of Jack's parents are Canadian veterans. Angela served first as an air traffic controller then went on to become a JAG officer after completing her law degree. Brad (a retired RCAF Lieutenant Colonel) is a pilot who was deployed on several international missions. Brad received a surprise "hug" from his quilt as one of Jack's recommendations. Brad has also been a volunteer on the Temple Israel School / Youth Committee for several years.

On September 25th, Major Leona Crabb, (an Army Logistics Officer) was presented with *A Quilt of Valour* for her years of service and dedication to our country in Afghanistan, Eastern Europe and Canada. Leona is currently on the Temple Israel Ritual Committee. I'm not sure what was a bigger surprise, seeing me there or getting her quilt!



In July, Jack also sponsored a quilt for WWII Navy veteran, Alex Polowin. At the presentation of his quilt, Mr. Polowin shared his stories of being the only Jewish person in the crew and of their victory

against the last remaining Nazi warships on D Day. Pre-Covid, Mr. Polowin had been going to schools to tell his stories to the children and thought that was why he was asked to join us. He was overwhelmed with gratitude and pride when he received his quilt.

The other quilts that Jack sponsored went to other deserving veterans. I tell this story because I was very honoured to be part of the surprises and part of Jack's journey to becoming a Jewish adult. May he continue to be kind and giving, and may he, his family, Leona and all of our veterans continue to go from strength to strength.
