From the Pulpit



It's Adar, Let's Spread the Joy!

2022 got off to a bit of a rocky start. We found ourselves once again with the pandemic blues, and then the trucks rolled into the capital. More so than usual, it was and continues to be a heavy winter. Where do we look to for some needed cheer? We have a number of traditional

resources in fact!

The month of Adar is best known as the month of Purim! Thematically, Purim is about laughter and cheer. The hope is that this festive mood presides over the entire month! In fact, the Rabbis mandate, "When the month of Adar enters, we increase our happiness" (Ta'anit 29a). Since we have 2 months of Adar this year, we have 2 months to be happy!

Of all the mitzvoth that we are commanded to do, this basic imperative is perhaps one of the most difficult to achieve. How can an emotion be mandated? If only "being happy" was as methodical as lighting Shabbat candles or keeping kashrut. Surely the Rabbis knew that demanding happiness was potentially unreasonable. In ordering this commandment, the Rabbis were affirming the importance of remembering the Purim story and the miracle it entailed. On Purim we read the Scroll of Esther; the story of the wicked Haman who longed to destroy the Jewish people. The Jews fasted and repented. Esther saves the day, proceeds to identify herself as a Jew and reveals Haman's wicked ways. The Purim story tells us about a hopeless and frightening time. Esther and her people turn things around, restore order and provide much reason to celebrate. As such, the Purim story is a source of inspiration. Even when things are dark, we should look out for light at the end of the tunnel. We are directed to find a better way.

As a synagogue community, we have lots of merriment in store for Purim. We'll travel to the 70's and channel our ABBA spirit as we join virtually for a Mamma Mia Megillah (see cover page). Our TIRS community will celebrate a little early on the 6th and 7th. A special highlight will be a Drag Time storyteller. And a Family Fun Purim flavoured Shabbat is scheduled for March 11th (see page 4)

Our ancestral Rabbis were no fools. They knew that they couldn't demand happiness. However, they could highlight the great value of positive thinking and hope. Let's move on from our rocky start to the year and look ahead to the promise. May you experience many joyous moments in this upcoming month!




Task Force Update

More than 40 Temple members have signed a Letter of Intent making a commitment to leave an after-lifetime gift to Temple Israel. Marsha and Allan Maslove are among those who believe in supporting Temple's future. Take the time to read their story. Helping 'warm and friendly' Temple Israel to continue

Soon after joining Temple Israel in 1976, Marsha and Allan Maslove became actively involved in Temple activities.

"Firstly, it was difficult to say no to Elaine and Irving!" explains Marsha, speaking of longtime volunteers extraordinaire and legends of Temple, the late Elaine and Irving Singer.

Marsha started out as a member of the School Committee. Shortly after, along with Harriet Schneider and Shayla Mindell, she assisted in establishing the Temple Library. For many years Marsha organized and set up the Break the Fast at Yom Kippur. Allan similarly has had many roles at Temple, spending many years on the Board and Executive and serving as Temple President from 1996 to 1998. He is currently Treasurer of the Temple Israel Foundation.

And among their valuable contributions to Temple - "Big bonus," says Marsha, "Allan and I introduced fellow Winnipegger Heather Cohen to the Temple." In May 2019, Executive Director Heather Cohen celebrated 30 years of service to our Temple community, and her years of dedication continue.

The Masloves are among the Temple members who have signed a Letter of Intent for Temple's Life and Legacy program.

"We chose Temple Israel because we were attracted to the Reform Movement," says Marsha. "When we attended services on James Street before formally joining, we were made to feel very welcome...Our first priority was egalitarian services, and we also appreciated the warm and friendly aspect of Temple."

Their children attended Temple Israel Religious School from grade one to Confirmation, and both celebrated their Bar and Bat Mitzvah at Temple as well. Their daughter now lives in Guelph with her husband and two sons, and their son lives in Kingston with his wife and two daughters.

Allan is a retired professor, and Marsha, a retired librarian who currently volunteers at the Queensway Carleton Hospital as well as the Malca Pass library.

Did you know...?

Youth scholarships are available, up to a \$500 limit, to Temple youth to encourage the development of Leadership skills, and to promote a strong connection to the Reform movement and Israel. 


