From the Pulpit

Learning to Swim (Again!)

Nachshon is one of my favourite Biblical heroes. He was the brotherin-law to Aaron, a leader of the tribe of Judah, but we recognize him not for his lineage, rather his bravery and courage that stood out amidst a time of fear and cynicism. We're introduced to Nachshon after the Israelites escape their time as slaves in Egypt. They came to the shore

of the Sea of Reeds, a problem since they did not know how to swim. A commotion ensues as the Israelites turn on Moses, "How could you lead us on with promise of better days, only to take us to the water where we will most certainly drown?" Nachshon removes himself from the group and begins to wade into the water. He demonstrates faith in himself, in the potential for a better day, in God. As we know, the sea will split in two and the Israelites will cross in song and dance.

I call on us to mobilize our Nachshon like spirit in days ahead. For some of our younger folks this might mean literally diving into the water for the first time. But my words are metaphorical today. These continue to be difficult days. In addition to our pandemic worries, we are presently overwhelmed by inflation, civil angst, and a general unease. Many of us are finding ourselves frustrated and angry. Our challenge is to channel this energy in constructive ways. Even as we recognize increased costs, we can double down on tzedakah, recognizing we're all called to give to the best of our abilities. We can rise to the occasion as advocates for a better tomorrow, this is our specialty at Temple Israel. In particular, as I prepare my words I'm conscious of our collective shock at the overturning of Roe vs Wade and the need to stand with our American siblings at this difficult moment. And finally, when faced with obstacles we can respond with love and hope, even when it seems insurmountable and everyone around us is fearful.

One more Nachshon like action for us to consider. We're out of routine in terms of attending Shabbat services at Temple. Let's take the plunge into the waters and make that extra effort to "come home." Many of us have been dabbling in recent days, and discovering that it's so nice to be back, rejuvenating in countless ways. We'd welcome giving you an honour such as an aliyah, reading or opening the ark. Just call the office if you want to set this up in advance. Starting July 1, we'll do outdoor Friday nights every other week (weather permitting) in the backyard of the bayit. And our monthly dinner service is returning too, July 8th is our first! Lots of opportunities to re-connect.

Please mark your calendars for the weekend of Aug 5-7. We welcome our new Student Cantor Ilana Mulcahy on her first trip to Ottawa (and Canada!). There will be lots of opportunities to get to know her as we celebrate her addition to the family.

I wish you all a wonderful summer. It's supposed to be a hot one, good thing we know how to swim!

While a few people spent the days before the auction nervously wondering if we could succeed, we are very pleased with the results and look forward to other ideas for fundraising events that can take place in the future. 
