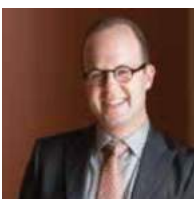

Rosh Hashana


Sunday September 25th


 **Family Fun Rosh Hashana (5:00-5:45PM, Temple School Level)** – This is a creative tot experience to celebrate the birthday of the world. Get set for songs, activities, stories and of course shofar blowing. Intended for children under 6 and their families. Led by Rabbi Mikelberg and Student Cantor Mulcahy.


 **Traditional Evening Service (8:00PM, Sanctuary)** – We officially welcome the new year with erev Rosh Hashana worship services from the Temple Israel bimah. Rabbi Garten will deliver words of teaching.

Yom Kippur

Tuesday October 4th

 **Family Fun Yom Kippur (5:00-5:45PM, Temple School Level)** – This is a creative tot experience centering on learning from mistakes and saying 'I'm sorry'. With song, stories, and activities, we'll explore the themes of this important day. Intended for children under 6. Led by Rabbi Mikelberg and Student Cantor Mulcahy.


 **Kol Nidre (6:30-7:30PM, Sanctuary)** - A slightly abridged service, accessible to all, that will include classical holiday liturgy as well as music from our instrumentalists: Dina Namer on piano and Paul Marleyn on cello performing Kol Nidre. Sermon delivered by Rabbi Garten.

 **Traditional Kol Nidre (8:00PM, Sanctuary)** – We'll begin our soulful journey with the stirring instrumental music of the day performed by Dina Namer on piano and Paul Marleyn on cello, followed by the festival liturgy. Sermon delivered by Rabbi Mikelberg.



Monday September 26th


L'Dor v'Dor Morning Service (9:00-10:00AM, Tent) – An abridged and creative service including holiday liturgical highlights and Torah reading intended for school age children and their families as well as for those looking to be outdoors. Offerings will be accessible to both the young and the young at heart. Led by Rabbi Mikelberg and Student Cantor Mulcahy.

 **Jonah Reading and Text Study (2:45PM, Sanctuary)** - Mort Bercovitch will take us on a theatrical journey with his reading of Jonah. Rabbi Garten will continue with a textual study of this riveting tale of a naïve man trying to run away from his responsibilities.

 **Yizkor Memorial Service (4:45PM, Sanctuary)** – The holiday season can be difficult as we hold close our loved ones who have passed on. We will honour their memory as we grieve, reflect and carry the legacy of our loved ones forward.

 **Neila (6:00PM, Sanctuary)** As the sun begins to set, we will join for our concluding prayers.

Outdoors Break-fast (6:45PM, Tent) – After two years of yearning to schmooze and nosh with one another, let's mark the end of Yom Kippur as a community in our tent.

Building Renewal

Building renewal – a glimpse of our future!



Temple Israel's building has served us well for 47 years, but it's time for a refresh. Accessibility, safety and security, and aesthetic improvements are needed.

In August the Board of Directors unanimously approved the architect's plans and agreed to move to a congregational vote. There will be many opportunities to familiarize yourselves with the plans. An email on registering for online or live Information Sessions will be coming out very soon. Over the High Holy Days, project ambassadors will be available to speak to you and plans will be on display.



On October 13, all members and member companions can vote in person or online on moving forward with the renewal. Another special mailing in early October will explain how you can register for the Congregational vote.



The project focuses on addressing these six themes:

- Building renewal - creating a physically accessible home for the future
- Community renewal - creating spaces for growth as a community
- Spiritual growth - enhancing the Sanctuary as a place for this growth
- Social inclusivity - strengthening Temple as an inclusive home for ALL routes to Judaism
- School renewal - supporting the learning and involvement of future generations - l'dor v'dor
- Secure community - keeping the congregation safe through enhanced security



The cost of the building renovation and expansion is \$4.3M. Thanks to 15 generous member families, Temple has already raised \$2.7M in pledges and donations.

A campaign to raise the \$1.6M remaining will launch following the successful congregational vote.

OUR FRAGILE DEMOCRACY WITH ANDREW COHEN

Andrew Cohen is an author, columnist and broadcaster who joined the Carleton School of Journalism and Communication in 2001. In a career of 40 years, he has worked in Ottawa, Toronto, Washington, London and Berlin. He has written for The Globe and Mail, The New York Times, Foreign Affairs, United Press International, Time, CNN.com, and The Pittsburgh Post-Gazette, among other publications.

The big, continuing story in America is the erosion of civility and rise of vulgarity in public discourse; the assault on voting rights; the decline of moral authority of Congress and the Supreme Court. Abroad, the forces of autocracy are winning in Russia, of course, which is now moving quickly from authoritarianism to totalitarianism. Anti-democratic forces dominate Hungary, Turkey, Brazil, and threaten in France. In many places, the pro-Putin forces are winning. In Canada, we had our own brush with anti-democratic behaviour this winter, and we must be vigilant.
