From the Pulpit



Such a pleasure to see and "see" so many of you over the holiday season. I hope that you'll agree that we welcomed 5783 successfully with great hope for tomorrow. Reflecting on these difficult two years, we are more aware than ever of the essential role of synagogue life to our well-being. Onwards, we continue to use Torah as a guide and blossom in various directions.

Our original Rabbis articulated in the Pirke Avot (5:21) a map of one's life journey: At 5 years of age the study of Torah, at 13 the subject of mitzvot, at 30 the peak of strength, at 50 able to give counsel. Amazing to note that in the general sense, this map is consistent (I admit that I was selective in choosing the years to highlight!). And as much as these words were intended to speak to the individual, they also guide us as a community, reminding us of our growth with time and the milestones that we mark.

Our Temple journey begin in 1966 when 17 families joined together in W.E. Gowling Public School for the first oneg shabbat of the newly formed Jewish Reform congregation of Ottawa. The following year our constitution was ratified, the choir was formed and the religious school was opened. These leaders of the community recognized the essential need for a creative progressive Jewish voice in the nation's capital. From its earliest days, we have consistently celebrated our role as a synagogue, as a place of learning and as a source of music, so that we may live our Judaism with enthusiasm and pride.

In 1975, a groundbreaking ceremony took place for our current facility, centrally located, on Prince of Wales Drive. This has become our permanent home where we gather as a Temple Israel family. Here we have commemorated our holidays, life cycle events and key community moments. Our family is now over 300 families and we continue to honour our progressive brand of Judaism.

Today, we are approaching the next significant moment in Temple's history: We are preparing for a major facility upgrade to serve our current membership and the next generations. After more than 40 years, we must address structural challenges and new needs in order to fulfill our vision which will enable us to continue to serve our congregation with strength.

We can be proud of our accomplishments as we reflect on our journey. As we continue to travel, each of us plays an important role. I am grateful for our original trailblazers and I am thankful for our present day leaders who are guiding us at this pivotal moment in time. Thank you in advance for your generosity and care. For the ancient Rabbis, they highlighted the year 70 as a time to appreciate "fullness of years." Much to look forward to in deed as we get to 2034 (well, first let's get to 2024 in our new digs!).

IMRE ROSENBERG LECTURE



Andrew Cohen is a best-selling author, an award-winning journalist and a professor of journalism at Carleton University. In a career of 44 years, Cohen has worked in Ottawa, Toronto, Berlin, London, and Washington, where he was correspondent for The Globe and Mail. Since 2002 he has written a weekly column for The Ottawa Citizen, appearing in newspapers across Canada. His seven books of history, biography and commentary range in subjects from Canada's constitutional politics to national character and Arctic exploration. His latest book, Two Days in June: John F. Kennedy and the 48 Hours That Made History, has been nominated for three literary awards and optioned as a feature film in Hollywood. A Fulbright Scholar, Cohen appears regularly on television and radio, and speaks often on American politics and international affairs.

The big, continuing story in America is the erosion of civility and rise of vulgarity in public discourse; the assault on voting rights; the decline of moral authority of Congress and the Supreme Court. Abroad, the forces of autocracy are winning in Russia, of course, which is now moving quickly from authoritarianism to totalitarianism. Anti-democratic forces dominate Hungary, Turkey, Brazil, and threaten in France. In many places, the pro-Putin forces are winning. In Canada, we had our own brush with anti-democratic behaviour this winter, and we must be vigilant.

Door to the Future Campaign

Temple's building renewal project and the *Door to* the Future Campaign are moving ahead!



On October 13, Temple Israel members voted in record numbers to expand and renovate our Temple building.

Your voices were overwhelmingly heard - and thanks to your support, Temple is moving ahead with the renewal of our spiritual home.

Funding the Future

To fund our synagogue's renewal, the \$4.3M Door to the Future Campaign was launched at Kabbalat Shabbat on October 28.

60% of the Campaign goal has already been secured in the form of \$2.7M from 15 very generous Temple families. We thank them with our deepest gratitude for their commitments.

With the generosity and support of the rest of the community, we seek to raise a further \$1.6M to take us through our door to the future.

"We have a great team assembled," said Gary Viner, speaking at the launch event on behalf of his Campaign Cabinet co-chairs, Margot Montgomery and Christine Kessler.



Gary and his wife Debra have long roots in the Temple going back to 1977. They have both played multiple executive roles over the years, as well as enjoyed three generations of milestone events.

"We are committed to Temple," he said, "and now that I am semi-retired from my family medicine academic practice, I now have the time to devote!"

He said that he is "extremely optimistic" about Temple's ability to raise the necessary funds and hopefully even more. "Our goal is to complete this fundraising by spring, so that work will be able to commence once the construction season starts...Every gift counts, and will be welcomed with thanks!"

In the coming weeks and months, our Campaign Team, along with Campaign Committee chairs, Sarah Berns, Leona Crabb, Mark Holzman, Patsy Royer, Aliza Rudner, and Aviva Stewart will reach out to you with an invitation to become involved. We hope you will join us in building the future for generations of Temple members to come. We thank our volunteers for their service.

We also thank President Miriam Burke and the members of the Building Renewal Action Committee for their tireless efforts in getting us to this point.

Yahrzeit: Remembering on the Anniversary of a Death

Yahrzeit is a Yiddish word meaning anniversary of a death. It is the yearly anniversary of a loved one's death. Jews observe vahrzeit at home by lighting a special long-burning candle in memory of the deceased and at Temple yahrzeit is observed by reciting the Mourner's Kaddish at services. The names of deceased with yahrzeit during the preceeding week are read at our services on Friday nights and Saturdays.

Temple Israel is Ottawa's Reform congregation where Jewish Life Happens --committing ourselves to Kehilah, K'lal Yisrael, and Tikun Olam.
