

From the Pulpit



We're often referred to as the People of the Book, as in a nation whose identity is tied to Torah. There are the Biblical stories that we read each week as well as the modern day collective experiences that also speak to our identity. While there are countless unique stories contained in the fabric of our soul, the values for which we conduct ourselves are

consistent. They include a deep appreciation of peoplehood, a recognition that each of us plays an essential role, a nurturing of our faith. The narrative of our congregation parallels that of the Jewish people as a whole.

In 1966, 17 Jewish families in Ottawa had a dream, they imagined a progressive hub in the capital, a congregation with a Reform identity. Their first priorities were Shabbat and Holiday worship, a religious school and a choir. Today we have multiplied, numbering more that 300 families, we continue to celebrate our prayer, school and music. Of course, we can now add to that list our commitment to social justice, our deep appreciation for inclusion, a willingness to innovate. In our almost 60 years we have shared so much as an extended family.

No doubt the evolution of our facility has represented guite an expansive tale. We find ourselves at a key moment. To date we have raised almost 3.8 million dollars. This is nothing short of extraordinary. Many of you have dug deep in order to ensure that our congregation continues to be strong into the next generation. It's as we invest in our spiritual home that we ensure that we live our essential Jewish values.

As with any building journey, there are hiccups along the way, unexpected circumstances to be managed. In the 10 months since we commenced our fundraising journey, building project costs have increased significantly. This is due to a variety of factors including a labour shortage and the impact of inflation on materials. We're not alone in facing these circumstances as we make construction plans. Rest assured, we remain strongly committed to enhancing our physical home to make it inclusive, with enhanced accessibility and safety. The Building Renewal Steering Committee is working to investigate and mitigate costs with the goal of recommending to the board the best path forward.

Where is it that we seek inspiration in difficult times? Our Torah can be a great resource. When facing challenges, as a people we've overcome. When feeling alone, we've looked to one another recognizing our enduring strength. When the need is great, we've dug deeper and maintained our hopeful spirits.

Onwards we go. Thank you to each of you for giving as best that you can in a variety of ways. Our path continues, the promised land awaits.

President's Message



Do you remember the story of the 'Little Engine that Could'? It's the story of a little train trying to make its way up a mountain, and it can't seem to find a steam engine willing to help it reach its goal. But the little engine tries its best and while repeating the words "I think I can, I think I can", and by not giving up, the little engine overcomes a seem-

ingly impossible task. Sound familiar? Well, we are on our way up the mountain. We are more than halfway there. Giving up? Not an option! We have already proven that as a community, we are committed to this building project. Sure, we have had a set-back. Project costs have increased from \$4.3M to \$6.5M due to several unforeseen factors that exceed our contingency plans. No one is surprised. Who could have predicted the rising cost of groceries, much less cement and steel! But it only means that we must rethink the plans and figure out how to spend within our means to reach our goal. It'll mean digging a little deeper, and I know that the fundraising campaign is hard at work on that, but I firmly believe we can still get there. The construction committee is exploring design changes with our project management team and other members of the design team with the objective of fitting the project within our means. They are working on creative ways to reduce the footprint while maintaining our functional priorities. And our Finance team is looking at every option for financing that will ensure that Temple is in good standing going forward. I assure you, we are committed to a renewed, fully accessible and secure building which maintains as many of the functional priorities of the current design as possible within our funding capacity.

It is so inspiring to see our Temple family coming together to work towards our shared objective. Todah Rabah to all of you for giving your time, your expertise and yes, your financial support. It's remarkable to see so many of you stepping up in so many ways. And just like the little engine that could, I think we can, and I know we will; speed bumps are to be expected and we are resilient and committed.





In Case You Missed It

Art installation 'Honouring our lost' a moving part of Temple's Yom Hashoah service



A highlight of Temple Israel's recent Yom Hashoah Service April 16 was a unique and personal art installation created by ceramic artist Susan Fried.

"Looking at the work that I'd done, I realized that everything was informed by my thoughts and inherited memories of being second-generation Holocaust survivor,"

says Susan, who is a Temple member and board secretary. "I felt it was appropriate to use that energy to create my own memorial to honor our lost."

She began working on that particular piece in January. "Not intentionally to coincide with Yom Hashoah, but it just fell into place. It was a big step for me and it was amazing."

A longtime Montrealer, Susan has been in Ottawa for 23 years, and at Temple for the past seven. She is finishing up a Fine Arts Program at the Ottawa School of Art.

The feedback was emotional and thoughtful as people looked and considered the meaning of the work. The impact was strong and the response was a passionate. "Interestingly, many people who were looking at it suggested it find a permanent location. A lot of great ideas came up...I'll work on where to place it, I'll see. Or perhaps a place to bring it back every year."

She felt she "needed to create something that honored our lost, but it's not meant to speak only to people connected to or knowledgeable about the Holocaust."

"I like to work in clay. The slabs, or headstones are made of clay and so are the little rocks. I used Cyano a non-silver photo printing process to print the images onto the clay. I used specific images like the Star of David and the Mourners Kaddish but let some of the other images evolve through the printing process. It was a matter of how to find a vehicle to make the pieces recognizable as some form of headstone, to convey only what I can vividly imagine. The tracks are one quarter scale."

The creative process had meaning for her as a place to share her thoughts. "I know there are memorials all over the world, but I needed to make a memorial myself." This work is called "Honoring Our Lost."

"The inherited memories live with me," she says. "It's important for me to face them and make my own images."



When Susan began making the installation, she felt she should speak to others who were second and third generation to get their perspectives and hear a little of their stories. It was Rabbi Mikelberg who afterward suggested she bring it to Temple and expose it there.



Jews observe yahrzeit at home by lighting a special long-burning candle in memory of the deceased and at Temple yahrzeit is observed by reciting the Mourner's Kaddish at services.
